



- Quiet neighborhoods

- Great parks need continued maintenance, programming and planning
- Need bike paths and trails to connect to Downtown & neighborhoods
- Train crossings and safety are a top priority

ECIST

- Many nice neighborhoods that are well maintained and walkable
- Cleveland Road is a significant corridor
- Many development opportunities along Cedar Point Dr / First St
- Pockets of vacant land
- Great park amenity (Big Island)
- Entry to Cedar Point / tourism centric
- Could be a great area to develop new housing types that can attract young families & professionals

SANDUSKY 2018: NEIGHBORHOOD MEETING

South

- Lack of connectivity to other neighborhoods
- Need for greater handicapped accessibility
 Varied condition of housing stock good
- Varied condition of housing stock good areas & bad areas
- Pockets of abandonment & blight
- Not enough home ownership / too many rentals & landlords that don't maintain property
- Redevelopment of American Crayon as a public amenity (i.e. recreation center)
- Expanded social services & the Conestoga program including volunteer opportunities, job training, home maintenance, family services, and community interaction events (build pride)


