
# **APA Ohio**

APA Ohio is a statewide, non-profit 501(c)(3) association of citizen and professional planners committed to promoting and enhancing planning and the quality of planning for all governmental entities in order to maintain and improve the quality of life for all Ohioans. APA Ohio is a state chapter of the American Planning Association (APA) and is in the top third grouping of largest chapters (based on membership).

### **Sections**

APA Ohio is comprised of five geographic sections. Sections coordinate and sponsor various activities and programs along with partnering with the Chapter to host state-wide conferences. Sections are well known for hosting their annual planning and zoning workshops.






